After 30+ years of serving the Senior Center, the CAP Lunch program has come to an end.

For over 30 years the CAP lunch program has been the heart beat of the Senior Center. It was the place where announcements were made, birthdays were celebrated, friendships were forged, community was created and where Bean Bag Baseball players were recruited For most of those years, CAP lunches were served on Wednesdays and Fridays, typically serving about 50 lunches per week. In the last ten years, lunches have been served to a smaller group of faithful "lunch people" on Wednesdays. Suffice it to say that over the years, CAP has served thousands of lunches to seniors in Castle Rock and will forever be part of the Senior Center's and CAP's shared legacy.

In addition to the end of the CAP program, this unfortunately also means the end of our collaborative relationship with the Castle Rock High School with the Bridging the Generations Program. Bridging the Generations was a program started 19 years ago, where High School students came to the Center to serve and share lunch with the Seniors. It was an opportunity to connect across generations. Many students described their experience with the Senior Center as one of the highlights of their High School experience. In addition, each year the Senior Center invited graduating High School seniors in the program to apply for a scholarship toward college. Each year 3-5 \$300 scholarships were awarded by the generous contributions of our members. Over the years thousands of dollars in scholarships were given out. The end of this collaboration is a significant loss for both the High School and Senior Center.

With that said, the Senior Center is making plans to contact the High School to determine if there are other ways to keep the Bridging of Generations program in place, and to continue our scholarship program. Hopefully, we will be successful.
